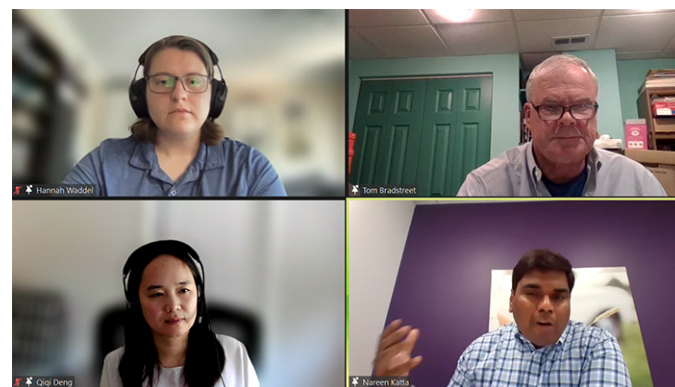
RECENT EVENT: PHARMACEUTICAL INDUSTRIES THE FOCUS OF LATEST NISS CAREER FAIR

NISS hosted another Virtual Career Fair on Wednesday, June 15, 2022! This career fair brought together statisticians from the pharmaceutical industry to share their advice with prospective applicants and provided current opportunities for statisticians/data scientists from three companies in the pharmaceutical industry. Attendees were also given an inside look at the research that statisticians in these three companies get involved in.

During this pharmaceutical career fair, our panel included Qiqi Deng with Moderna, Nareem Katta with AbbVie, and Tom Bradstreet with Bristol-Myers Squibb. This session's Moderator was Hannah Waddel, a Ph.D. student from the Biostatistics Department at Emory University as well as one of our NISS Graduate Student Network Executive Committee Members.

This career fair began with a brief presentation from Qiqi Deng highlighting career paths and opportunities in Moderna, followed by an overview of AbbVie by Nareem Katta. After these presentations, we continued the session as a panel discussion with Tom Bradstreet who further provided guidance on what is truly essential to new hires in the statistics or data science fields from his experience.

- “Total statistical uncertainty” frameworks for estimates derived

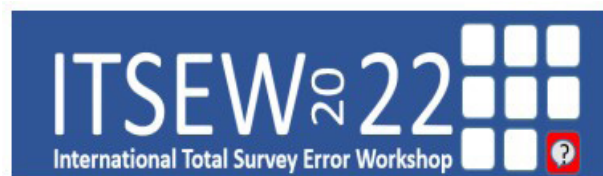
